## Gospel Reflection

In today's Gospel passage Jesus continues His instruction on how to follow Him. The Good News for all of us is that anyone who works in the name of Jesus or serves others in His name belongs to Jesus. It is all about the question of belonging to Jesus. Jesus' reply to John's question and comment shows how His tolerant and accepting heart rejoices in goodness, no matter where it's found.

There is also a lesson in ecumenism for us – long before that word became popular. Ecumenism means “working together with others for Jesus.” In the first reading we notice how Moses was only too glad that the elders who missed the special meeting also received God's spirit. He told his complaining aide, Joshua, that we must not impose limitations on what God does or wishes to do on the person God chooses.

The Gospel incident is similar. John complained to Jesus that there was a man using His holy name to expel demons. But Jesus, like Moses, did not want that man stopped in his good work. Jesus said, “Anyone who is not against us is with us.”

Naturally and properly, we owe respect to our Church with its rules and ways of worship. We rejoice that God is present to us and with us, but we should not presume that God is absent to others because they do not belong to our Church. Churches should not quarrel over who is right and who is wrong but should acknowledge the differences. And we have the best possible precedent for this course of action in both the Old and the New Testaments with Jesus and Moses' example. Jesus in particular, never rejected anyone, instead encouraging dialogue.
