## Gospel Reflection

In Mark's Gospel this is a very significant miracle and a very significant incident in the life of Jesus for his young church community...akin to the significance of last Sunday's incident involving James and John and their unacceptable request.

The first part of Mark's Gospel asks: **Who is Jesus?** We remember Peter answered that correctly: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

The second part of Mark's Gospel asks: **WHERE is Jesus going?** For the past seven Sundays our Gospel passages have shown us Jesus teaching that His way would be one of humble service, and indeed the way of the Cross. Jesus would use the "Washing of His disciples' feet" as the supreme example of what He was proposing.

We can see that Bartimaeus, blind and all as he was, understood Jesus much better than James and John...he did NOT look for a selfish favour!

For each of us then Bartimaeus is THE MODEL for all disciples, like ourselves, in post-Resurrection times...when Jesus is no longer seen. Although Bartimaeus does not see Jesus, he hears the word from others and he believes. He threw off the cloak of his old ways and started to follow Jesus.

We are blessed because we do not see, yet believe. We pray that out of our **Reflection on today's Gospel, our faith will be deepened and our trust in God** and in Providence.

This Gospel is alive and active and is meant for us today. Each of us is blind **in some way**. We may be unable to see another's point of view, unable to see how our behaviour is hurting someone close to us. We are blind to our own prejudices; our eyes are closed to the reality of our greed or selfishness. At least Bartimaeus knew he was blind.
