## Gospel Reflection

“Love is all you need” - Beatles. Jesus would agree but not a soppy emotion, rather a strong, sincere and real love for God and neighbours. The latter PROVING the former.

Today’s Gospel text follows series of hostile interviews and questions by Jesus enemies: Questions regarding taxes, divorce, resurrection of the dead etc. In answering today’s question...Jesus quotes the classic texts from Hebrew Scriptures - Deuter 6 and Leviticus 19.18 Its worth while listening to the full text. “You shall love the Lord, your God with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your strength. Engrave on your heart the comment I pass onto you today. Repeat them over and over again to your children. Speak of them when you are at home and when you travel; when you lie down and when you rise. Brand them on your hand as a sign and keep them always before your eyes. Engrave them on your doorposts and on your city gats.” Leviticus adds: “Love your neighbour as yourself.”

In answering this question...Jesus talks straight and direct. He speaks the truth as outlined in the Law and the Prophets down through centuries...and this truth goes to the heart of WHAT IT IS TO BE FULLY HUMAN.

What is this love which holds us in being and to which we must respond? It is in head or heart; in the feeling or the will? Perhaps it is in the choosing. We choose to keep as close to him as we can; to give him all that we do even if it often goes wrong. All love is part of God’s love. He IS love. We can simply want to put him first, and ask him not to let us deny him.

“Love your neighbour as yourself”. As if he or she were myself? And that poses the question as to how I do, in fact, love myself. It is hard to love others if we do not feel loveable. If, for reasons in our past or in the present, we dislike what we see in ourselves, or have a crushing sense of unworthiness, how can we love as Christ asks us? There are no glib answers, for self esteem once lost is hard to recover, and indeed we may need the help of another, whose value of us enables us to see our own. Paradoxically, it is often in recognising the worth of another person that we find our own.

We are valued, of course, each one of us. We are loved, truly loved by Christ himself. He loved his own to the end, and we are his own.
