Gospel Reflection Trinity Sunday



Jesus is God's wonderful and on-going adventure with our human race, with each of us. To make our journey to God, we begin with Jesus. We remember all the parables and stories He told us about His loving, tender and compassionate Father. From Jesus we learn that God is a God of love, as Plato had surmised long ago. And from Jesus we learn that there

is relationship and family in the Trinity. With Jesus as our guide, we are able to move beyond the textbook definitions and the Catechism's theological language to a more personal relationship with Jesus, our Saviour.

We are created in God's image. That means we are created for relationship, for togetherness and love. We find this in married life, in consecrated religious life, in friendship and in love. We are created to share in that community of love which is the living God. In celebrating this Feast, then, we rejoice in the glory of God whose life and love we share - a love which flows from the Father; is revealed to us in Jesus, His Son, and is poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who lives within us and came to us in our Baptism.

There are so many ways of describing God, because actually words are not enough. If we borrowed Saint Exupery's words we could describe God as "endless immensity" and perhaps that would give us another glimpse of the truth. If we were to long for the 'endless immensity' of God, would that help us to build lives that were focused on God, instead of on numbers and the accumulation of things?

In today's Gospel we read that even at this stage of the disciples' journey some still hesitate, and Jesus reassures them. We too may have doubts and difficulties on our life's journey. We cannot always grasp everything, or prove everything; some things can't be described in words and some things can't be counted in numbers. Just think of the question, "How much do you love me?" What is the answer? It's something that can't be calculated.

God sends us into the world, asking us to have faith that we are not alone, telling us that we do not need to be afraid. God's spirit is present in us. As people of faith we are called to grow in that faith, to grow closer to God. That's something that will require us to use our imagination as well as our intellect.
