WELCOME

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Greetings to you all!

A good intention alone is not sufficient, but it must be carried out in action too. One day a young man came to Jesus with a question: 'Good master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' This request shows his zeal and his ultimate desire of life. He makes this request out of his free will. So, it is neither forced on him nor is he trying to test Jesus, rather it was a genuine request of the young man. When Jesus guided him through the commandments of the Lord, the young man said that he has kept everything right from his childhood.

Now Jesus is taking him to the next level of learning/discipleship: "Jesus looked steadily at him and loved him, and he said, 'There is one thing you lack. Go and sell everything you own and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.' But his face fell at these words, and he went away sad, for he was a man of great wealth." Yes, Jesus invited him to go to the next level of learning and attain his desired goal (the eternal life), but the young person was not ready to let go of his wealth.

This is a story of a bird that took shelter in the withered branches of a tree that stood in the middle of a vast deserted plain. One day a whirlwind uprooted the tree forcing the poor bird to fly a hundred miles in search of shelter, till it finally came to a forest of fruit-laden trees. If the withered tree had survived, nothing would have induced the bird to give up its security and fly. And if it had not sacrificed its security, it would not have gone to a forest of fruity-laden trees.

So, when Jesus asked the rich man to go and sell everything he had and follow him, he was not condemning riches but was advising him to use his riches not just for his own pleasures, but to give a decent life to the poor and thus make himself happier and this world a better place for all to live in.

Let us always remember that whenever Jesus challenges us to move forward; he has found something that we are capable of doing more which will benefit not only us but the entire world. Jesus does not condemn rich people; but only those who are not willing to share and sacrifice for the sake of others. Let us always learn to share and be happy in our lives. Amen
