WELCOME

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Greetings to you all!

Venerable Servant of God Fulton J. Sheen says, "Unless there is a Good Friday in your life, there can be no Easter Sunday." Life is a mixture of joys and sorrows. But it is a human nature to avoid pain, suffering and work constantly to be always joyful in our lives. When Jesus called his disciples, his message was clear like a bell. He told them: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me." (Mt 16:24). Jesus never promised an easy path to remain as his followers, rather he told them the truth that it requires sacrifices and willingness to suffer for the sake of the Kingdom of God.

Jesus for the third time foretold his Passion, death, and Resurrection, but still the disciples had not fathomed the full intention of God for his only Son Jesus. Jesus will bring glory to his father through his death on a cross. But the disciples still had not understood this message, that's why they were looking for authority and glory: "Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left in your glory." Jesus told them, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or to be baptised with the baptism with which I am baptised?" Jesus, knowing that his Apostles hadn't understood his message, was still gentle with James and John. He took this opportunity to tell them again that he would set up a glorious kingdom but that his sufferings and death would be a necessary prelude to its establishment. So, Jesus, continues to stress the fact that he will establish his glorious kingdom through his death on a cross, but the message fell into the deaf man's ears.

Jesus also further told his disciples about the primary characteristics of his disciples: "anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be first among you must be slave to all. For the Son of Man himself did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." So, the primary identity of a disciple of Christ does not consist in one's power, prestige, and authority but it consists in one's service to his/her brothers and sisters.

All of us, in one way or the other have been entrusted with some level of authority; they are given to us not to boss it over someone who is under our care, but to serve those who share in the image and likeness of God. Service to one's brothers and sisters is the beautiful statement a disciple of Jesus can leave to the world. A disciple who served his brothers and sisters will continue to live in the hearts and minds of the people. Amen.

within thy house forever.





On **Sunday, 17 October**, dioceses around the world will launch local preparations for the Synod of Bishops, which has the theme: "***For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission***". The Catholic Church in Australia will invite the People of God to make submissions via an online portal that will open on 17 October. A **[page on the Bishops Conference website](https://www.catholic.org.au/synodalchurch)** has been set up as a hub for Synod of Bishops content. It has links to the preparatory document and vademecum (handbook) for the Synod, and a video produced by the Sydney Centre for Evangelisation explaining the Synod process can also be accessed here:
