Gifts

- 1. Give a Christian book as a Christmas gift. (e.g. Teresa of Avila "Interior Castle").
- 2. Gift your spouse a weekend retreat at the Redemptorist or New Norcia monastery.
- 3. Help families overcome poverty via the Caritas Christmas appeal www.caritas.org.au/donate
- 4. Make a Christmas donation to St Vincent DePaul.
- 5. Make a donation to Life Link sufficient to cause you to go without something you'd like.

Prayers and Reflections

- 6. Ask Jesus and your favourite Saint to help us to be signs for God so that others can see His compassion, His love, His peace and joy, through us, through our daily Christian living.
- 7. Perhaps it is time to show your appreciation to your Guardian Angel.
- 8. An old Chinese proverb says, 'Dig the well before you are thirsty'. Advent is a time of preparation. There is no better way to prepare than through the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
- 9. Search 'Geoffrey Plant youtube' for a series of thoughtful Homilies from the Diocese of Sydney.
- 10. Pray that the real story of Christmas is not lost through commercialisation.

Personal

- 11. If you walk to Mass, resolve to say a decade or more of the rosary as you walk.
- 12. Resolve to buy "Fair Trade" products.
- 13. Start a "gratitude journal" and write down three things that went well for you during the day and thank the Lord for all the good things in your life.
- 14. Sign up to Cathnews a free service from the Australian Bishops Conference to keep abreast of issues affecting Catholics in Australia. www.cathnews.com.au
- 15. Commit to making a retreat before next Christmas.

Outreach

- 16. Invite an infrequent church-going friend or family member to join you for a Christmas mass.
- 17. Pray for all those preparing to enter the Church, particularly those in the RCIA program.
- 18. Put Christmas cards in the letterboxes of unknown neighbours complimenting them on a new paint job on their house, a new garden bed, an amazing bloom, an abundant crop etc.

Promises and Commitments

- 19. Resolve each day to profess, give witness to, or celebrate your faith in some way.
- 20. If your Lenten promise has lapsed or been forgotten, renew it for the month of January.
- 21. Resolve to imitate Jesus and react as He would when you find yourself having to make choices or decisions, particularly those that involve or impact others.
- 22. If your "Present to Jesus" is by way of a promise or commitment, write it in a Christmas card addressed "To Jesus from your name" and put it under the Christmas tree to remind all at gift opening time of the true meaning of Christmas. Afterwards, put the card somewhere where you will see it each day to remind you of what you resolved to do.
- 23. Resolve to introduce yourself to someone new after Mass or at a Parish Morning tea or similar function?

Donations

- 24. Make a donation to the parish, church or a diocesan building or restoration funds.
- 25. Have you tools or materials you could offer to the local "Men's Shed"? www.freomenshed.org.au
- 26. Your local Vinnies store would appreciate those no longer needed clothes.
- 27. Could you suggest someone who owes you money donate that amount to a Church charity as full loan repayment?

Time and Talents

- 28. Mow a lawn (or do something else) for a neighbour who may not be able to do it themselves.
- 29. Resolve to volunteer for some ministry in the parish and discover that it's a present for you as well as Jesus.
- 30. Become a volunteer at a Catholic Hospital or Nursing Home.
- 31. Become a New Norcia Volunteer.
- 32. Organise a fund raiser for a young person's visit to World Youth Day.

Family

- 33. Resolve as a family to go to a Christmas mass together.
- 34. As a "Family Gift" make a donation to the parish to cover the yearly or monthly cost of some small item of church expenditure (e.g. altar candles, altar wine, communion hosts, a month's electricity bill, printing cost of one week's "Saving Word" or one month's "Patrician").
- 35. "The family that prays together stays together." Now might be the time to renew the practice of grace before meals.
- 36. There's a saying that "world peace starts at the family dinner table", so why not commit as family to contribute to world peace.

Young Children

If you have young children or grandchildren you might:

- 37. Read a short version of the true Christmas story before opening the Christmas presents.
- Help introduce this Mary's Dream campaign, suitably modified for the age group, into your Catholic primary or high school.
- 39. Help them make their own nativity related Christmas cards.

Teenagers and young people

- 40. Have the Youth Group volunteer, as a group, to assist with a parish "busy bee".
- *41.* Invite someone outside your circle of friends to join your group in a social or sporting activity.
- 42. Off to Uni? Join a Christian Fellowship club at Uni. If there isn't one, then why not start one?
- *43.* Can you commit to being part of World Youth Day in Lisbon 2023?

Parish Initiatives

- 44. Produce a Catholic Businesses Directory for retail, trade or professional services being owned or run by Catholics in the suburbs serviced by the parish or in the near vicinity.
- 45. Establish a "lost and found" group whose role in the parish is to identify and tactfully check on the well-being of regular parishioners who don't attend mass for a number of weeks with an "Are you OK?" contact call or visit.
- 46. Publish a directory of parish lay ministries, activities, or social groups and invite folk to participate.
- 47. Could the parish learn from or contribute to the workings of other parishes? See: <u>www.buildingstrongerparishes.catholic.</u> org.au

- 48. Look for ways to include non-frequent Mass attendees in parish functions and activities.
- 49. Widen the roster system to encompass the many support roles members of the congregation can play at Mass as a way of encouraging more people to participate.

50. Can you think of other "presents" along these lines for Jesus as you see Him in your prayer life?
