Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Today we begin a new liturgical season called Advent. With Advent we also embark on a New Liturgical Year C. Whenever we begin something new, there is always new vigour, enthusiasm and of course a sense of wonder and expectation.

The next four weeks of preparation for the arrival of Jesus in our hearts and in the world are very crucial and important in our faith journey. Whenever we receive someone who is very important in our lives, we always do meticulous planning and preparations so that the visit becomes a memorable one.

If we can prepare for a person who has some power over us, how much more we all need to prepare to receive the very author of our lives; namely Jesus Christ, who is the Only begotten Son of God.

During these days of our preparations, the liturgy of the Word will invite us to take on board the challenge and the invitations of the Lord, so that we become worthy to receive the incarnate Son into our world.

The gospel today opens with these words, 'There will be signs in the sun and moon and stars; on earth nations in agony, bewildered by the clamour of the ocean. When these things begin to take place, stand erect, hold your heads high, because your liberation is near at hand.' These words are really daunting, aren't they? But if you pay close attention to these warnings of Christ, it is indeed comforting. Because Jesus says that when these things happen know that your liberation is very near. So, in short, if I live my Christian calling every day of my life, I will be longing for my union with Christ, who is my saviour.

In fact, Jesus' prophetic description of the destruction of the world, and the day of final judgment, were not new to the people of Israel. The prophets Isaiah, Joel, Jeremiah, Amos, and Zephaniah had foretold these events many centuries before. These signs are not intended to fill people with fear and trembling, except perhaps those who have failed to live out to their Christian living.

So, let us begin these days of our preparation for the birth of our Lord, with great joy and enthusiasm. Please also encourage others in this journey so that as people of God we will journey together to meet Christ and enjoy his Peace, joy and prosperity he gives us. Amen




