

Christ the King
November 20/21, 2021

WELCOME

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Greetings to you all!

Holy Mother Church celebrates the Solemnity of Christ the King; with this celebration we come to the end of the Liturgical Year B. This solemnity helps us to identify who one should follow and obey in one's life.

In 1925, through an encyclical ***Quas Primas*** Pope Pius XI instituted the Feast of Christ the King in the universal Church. Through this Solemnity, the holy Father has emphasised the supremacy of Jesus as the King of the universe. Because after the First World war there was a growing sense of secularism and the due respect for the creator was not given, so to emphasise the fact that God is the creator of the universe he instituted this feast.

In his encyclical, "***Quas Primas***" he noted that the continuing disorder of that era, what he called "the plague of society," had long been festering and was the result of nations rejecting Christ. Later in the encyclical the pontiff pointedly reminded national governments, "Christ, who has been cast out of public life, despised, neglected and ignored, will most severely avenge these insults; for His kingly dignity demands that the State should take account of the commandments of God and of Christian principles, both in making laws and in administering justice, and also in providing for the young a sound moral education" (No. 32).

Friends, this feast is a powerful reminder to all of us; because it helps us to identify who is our real boss in life. The history of the Church gives us many examples of men and women, who were either belonging to a religious order or living the ordinary life of the laity, bore witness to the supremacy of Jesus's kingship through their lives. Just to give a few examples: Polycarp, the bishop of Smyrna, when he was brought before the Roman authorities, was asked to curse, and disown the supremacy of Jesus, but he denied this saying, "Eighty-six years have I served him, and he has done me no wrong: how then can I blaspheme against my King, Jesus Christ, who saved me?" As a result, he was burnt to death. St. Thomas More was the Lord Chancellor of England during the reign of Henry VIII. St. Thomas More challenged the king over the issue of marriage and remarriage and trying to make himself head of the Church of England. As a result he resigned from his prestigious and wealthy position as Lord Chancellor and lived a life of poverty. His last recorded words were: "I die the king's good servant, but God's first."

WELCOME

So, friends as we live our daily lives, let us remember that we are pilgrims on earth marching towards our true and eternal King Jesus Christ. In all that we do and say proclaim the supremacy of Jesus. May the reign of Christ continue to live in our hearts and in the world. Amen.

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


