Family Mass for the Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time November 7, 2021

WELCOME

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Greetings to you all!

The liturgy of the word makes a reference to two widows, who placed their trust in God and generously donated from their resources. Both were very poor but placed their trust in God and they were rewarded by God.

I want to narrate two stories: this real story happened in the life of Mother Teresa of Calcutta. Once a person who looked after his personal needs from the generosity of people from the roadside came and said to her, mother I know everyone gives donations to you, so I also want to give you some money and he gave her 10 Rupees which is very minimum in comparison to an Aussie dollar. Mother thought for a while and said to herself, if I take this money from him, he will have nothing to eat today, but at the same time if I refuse, he may be hurt, so she put out her hand and received the money from him. Mother said, it was a big sacrifice for that poor man who had sat in the sun all day long and received only ten rupees. It was beautiful. Ten rupees is such a small amount, and I can get nothing with it, but as he gave it up and I took it, it became like thousands because it was given with so much love. God looks, not at the amount of money but at the love with which it is given.

The Second story, which I witnessed in my life. When I was in the Novitiate in Sri Lanka, every Sunday evening all the novices used to go for a walk. One Sunday after receiving our pocket money for the month (which is 60 rupees), we went to get what we needed for our personal care. As we were going a poor boy approached us and Edwin, who was my co-novice (now he has gone to God), just took all which he had received for the monthly expenses and just gave it to the boy. He did not rationalise, he just did it without even thinking about his need. Later when the novice master came to know of course he appreciated him and gave him money to buy what he needed for the month.

So, the word of God powerfully reminds us that, we must be charitable towards our needy neighbour, not only when we have some superfluous goods which we can give away, but even when we have only bare essentials our ourselves.





Elijah the Prophet went off to Sidon. And when he reached the city gate, there was a widow gathering sticks; addressing her he said, 'Please bring me a little water in a vessel for me to drink.' She was setting off to bring it when he called after her. 'Please' he said 'bring me a scrap of bread in your hand.' 'As the Lord your God lives,' she replied 'I have no baked bread, but only a handful of meal in a jar and a little oil in a jug; I am just gathering a stick or two to go and prepare this for myself and my son to eat, and then we shall die.' But Elijah said to her, 'Do not be afraid, go and do as you have said; but first make a little scone of it for me and bring it to me, and then make some for yourself and for your son. For thus the Lord speaks, the God of Israel:

"Jar of meal shall not be spent, jug of oil shall not be emptied, before the day when the Lord sends rain on the face of the earth."

The woman went and did as Elijah told her and they ate the food, she, himself and her son. The jar of meal was not spent nor the jug of oil emptied, just as the Lord had foretold through Elijah.


Humbled for a season, to receive a name from the lips of sinners, unto whom he came; faithfully he bore it spotless to the last, brought it back victorious when from death he passed;






