### WELCOME

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Emeritus Pope Benedict XVI dedicated 2012 as the "Year of Faith." During that year, he invited every baptised member of the church to profess, to celebrate, and to witness their faith. The feast of the Baptism of the Lord is a reminder to all of us about the call we have received from the Lord; to be his disciples and his witnesses in the world.

It is sad to see at times that the baptism ceremony has become one of the social events we go to, but it is not. It has a deep connection to the person of Jesus Christ who received his baptism at the hands of John the Baptist. There are many symbols used in the baptismal ceremony; the sign of the cross on the forehead of the child, water, sacred oils, white cloth, baptism candle, prayer over the mouth and ears and so forth; they all point to one reality that we all should become Christlike in our lives.

How to be a Christlike person? Once a group of missionaries around the world gathered for a conference, to discuss the methods that each one used in their evangelisation. Most of the missionaries in their presentation said how effectively they have utilised the modern media and their talents in their evangelisation and how effective they are. One of the missionaries, who was last to present said, "If I see something lacking in my mission, I take the family who live their Gospel values, "to be there with the people" and guide the people how each one can be a marvellous person we are created to be. He finished by saying that it really works, and the conference concluded.

Pope Paul VI, "Evangelii Nuntiandi" no. 41 says, "Modern man listens more willingly to witnesses than to teachers, and if he does listen to teachers, it is because they are witnesses." The baptism of Jesus is a powerful reminder about our own baptism. Every baptised member of the church should lead a witnessing life.

Every baptism ceremony will conclude saying, "Dear brothers and sisters, he/she has been reborn in baptism. They are now called children of God, for so indeed they are." Yes, through our baptism we all have become God's adopted children.

## A reading from the letter of St. Paul to Titus 2:11-14,3:4-7

God's grace has been revealed, and it has made salvation possible for the whole human race and taught us that what we have to do is to give up everything that does not lead to God, and all our worldly ambitions; we must be self-restrained and live good and religious lives here in this present world, while we are waiting in hope for the blessing which will come with the Appearing of the glory of our great God and saviour Christ Jesus. ### Gospel

## THE CREED

Reader: We pray for our own community that we will, through the way we live, show to those around us that Jesus matters. (Pause) Lord hear us. All: Lord, hear our prayer.

Reader: We pray for all those who are currently on holidays celebrating the return to safe travel during these difficult times. May they return home safe and well. (Pause) Lord hear us.

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

Reader: We pray for those who build churches and places of baptism that they will, through their art, lift us in the Spirit to live our beliefs. (Pause) Lord hear us. All: Lord, hear our prayer.

Celebrant: Loving Father, we know that you sent your Son to be our guide to eternal life and so in his name and in the power of the Spirit we confidently offer you our needs.

All: Amen.
