Greetings to you all!

All those who were reborn in the waters of baptism are called to do something in building up God's kingdom on earth. To achieve this, God calls those whom he desires at any moment of his or her life. Sometime the call of God comes to us like a sudden thunder and lightning in the sky.

There are numerous men and women in the history of salvation, who have generously responded to the call of God. When God looked for someone to be his messenger to speak to his chosen people (but they continued to remain unfaithful), Isaiah volunteered and accepted the vocation of prophet. For nearly 50 years (742-700) he tried to wean the people of Judah from their sinful ways. He constantly spoke to them about the infinite holiness of God as contrasted with their utter selfishness and sinful way of life. The life of the prophet Isaiah reveals to us his faithfulness and commitment to his vocation.

The gospel also narrates the call of the first four Apostles: Peter, Andrew, James, and John. They were all fishermen. Will anyone hire or appoint someone for a CEO position of his or her company, who is unknown, or unlettered and inexperienced? No. But Jesus chose his apostles, who were insignificant and perhaps not known to many in his time. If Jesus were to look for the intelligent and persons with great eloquence; he would have chosen many highly educated priests and scribes in Jerusalem, Roman officers in Palestine and Greek philosophers whose very name would add prestige to the Gospel message had they been Apostles. But Jesus did not entrust the task of spreading the good news and the keys of the kingdom to the abovementioned groups of people. He gave this great task to those whom society considered as insignificant. When Jesus called them, he looked at their hearts and their will, not who they were in the eyes of society.

Entrance Antiphon

O come, let us worship God and bow low before the God who made us, for he is the Lord our God.

First reading

A reading from the book of Prophet Isaiah 6:1-2,3-8 'Here I am: send me'

In the year of King Uzziah's death I saw the Lord of Hosts seated on a high throne; his train filled the sanctuary; above him stood seraphs, each one with six wings. And they cried out to one another in this way,

'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of Hosts. His glory fills the whole earth.'

The foundations of the threshold shook with the voice of the one who cried out, and the Temple was filled with smoke. I said:

'What a wretched state I am in! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have looked at the King, the Lord of Hosts.'

Second reading

A reading from the First Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians 15:1-11 I preached what the others preach, and you all believed

Brothers, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, the gospel that you received and in which you are firmly established; because the gospel will save you only if you keep believing exactly what I preached to you – believing anything else will not lead to anything.

Well then, in the first place, I taught you what I had been taught myself, namely that Christ died for our sins, in accordance with the scriptures; that he was buried; and that he was raised to life on the third day, in accordance with the scriptures; that he appeared first to Cephas and secondly to the Twelve. Next he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers at the same time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died; then he appeared to James, and then to all the apostles; and last of all he appeared to me too; it was as though I was born when no one expected it.

I am the least of the apostles; in fact, since I persecuted the Church of God, I hardly deserve the name apostle; but by God's grace that is what I am, and the grace that he gave me has not been fruitless. On the contrary, I, or rather the grace of God that is with me, have worked harder than any of the others; but what matters is that I preach what they preach, and this is what you all believed.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to St Luke 5:1-11 They left everything and followed him

Jesus was standing one day by the Lake of Gennesaret, with the crowd pressing round him listening to the word of God, when he caught sight of two boats close to the bank. The fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats – it was Simon's – and asked him to put out a little from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat.

When he had finished speaking he said to Simon, 'Put out into deep water and pay out your nets for a catch.' 'Master,' Simon replied, 'we worked hard all night long and caught nothing, but if you say so, I will pay out the nets.' And when they had done this they netted such a huge number of fish that their nets began to tear, so they signalled to their companions in the other boat to come and help them; when these came, they filled the two boats to sinking point.

Papal Approval of OMI Congregation

On February 17, 1826, Pope Leo XII approved the Congregation and its Constitutions and Rules.
