Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Greetings to you all!

Jesus continues his journey towards Jerusalem. During this journey this question was put to him: 'who will be saved'? To this question Jesus says that restrictions to entering the kingdom do not lie with God but with the human responses to this divine invitation. In other words, Jesus tells us that each one's salvation is in his own hands. All those who accept Christ, his teaching and the help he had made available to them will enter the kingdom of God.

God has given us the freedom to choose what we want in life. The Gospel passage today invites one to ask oneself, do I choose God or something else. To choose God in one's life needs to trust him fully because he will not abandon us. Rather he will see that the purpose of our creation will come into completion.

The poem written by Robert Frost, titled "The Road not Taken" gives the daring nature of the traveller who took the road which was not taken by anyone.

> TWO roads diverged in a yellow wood, And sorry I could not travel both And be one traveller, long I stood And looked down one as far as I could To where it bent in the undergrowth.

Then took the other, as just as fair, And having perhaps the better claim, Because it was grassy and wanted wear; Though as for that the passing there Had worn them really about the same,

And both that morning equally lay
In leaves no step had trodden black.
Oh, I kept the first for another day!
Yet knowing how way leads on to way,
I doubted if I should ever come back.

I shall be telling this with a sigh Somewhere ages and ages hence: Two roads diverged in a wood, and I I took the one less travelled by, And that has made all the difference.

The scriptures have many encouraging teachings to help a person to choose God all the time. If anyone could do it, then one could feel that they are all in safe hands and will never have to worry about the question: will I be saved? Jesus was aware of the path that he chose in his life in order to give glory to his father. What are your choices in life?

Have you forgotten that encouraging text in which you are addressed as sons? My son, when the Lord corrects you, do not treat it lightly; but do not get discouraged when he reprimands you. For the Lord trains the ones that he loves and he punishes all those that he acknowledges as his sons. Suffering is part of your training; God is treating you as his sons. Has there ever been any son whose father did not train him? Of course, any punishment is most painful at the time, and far from pleasant; but later, in those on whom it has been used, it bears fruit in peace and goodness.
