Dear Parishioners and Friends, Greetings to you all!

The Prophet Amos sends out a clear warning to those who practised injustice against the poor and helpless. The Prophet was chosen by God to go to Israel, the northern kingdom to go and speak to them in the name of God. He was called during the 8th century B.C. At that time the country enjoyed material prosperity, but idolatry and injustice were rife among the upper classes especially. Against these vices the prophet spoke fearlessly, until he was driven from the kingdom eventually.

The lives of the prophets will reveal to us that, their mission was not always an easy one, yet we see God wins at the end through the courageous proclamation of the prophets he chose and though their sacrifices too. The Prophet says, "Listen to this, you who trample on the needy and try to suppress the poor people of the country, you who say, 'When will New Moon be over so that we can sell our corn, and sabbath, so that we can market our wheat?... The Lord swears it by the pride of Jacob, 'Never will I forget a single thing you have done.' These words of the prophet sharply condemned those who are out to increase their wealth at the expense of the poor. God assures us that 'Never will I forget a single thing you have done.' We can feel that God watches over us and sees that justice is done for his chosen people. It is also true in the history of our salvation that God intervenes and looks after his chosen people, because God loves his people and does not abandon them. So, in our dealings with one another, let us always practise justice that everyone is entitled to in one's life. That way, we may not experience harsh punishment from God.

During this weekend, let us hold in our prayers the First Holy Communion candidates, from our Parish and the Confirmation candidates from IONA college that the reception of these sacraments will bring them closer to Christ. And may they continue to be his witnesses in the world. Amen
